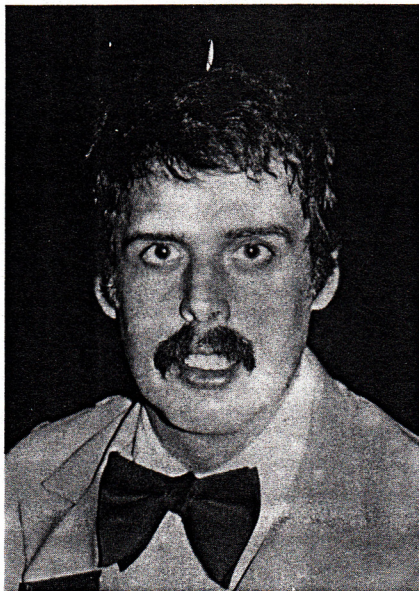

B.J. Brewitt

B.J. Brewitt of Warren died on Wednesday, June 16 at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit of pneumonia after a lengthy period of declining health.

Born on September 16, 1942 in Tacoma, Washington, Brewitt served in the U.S.

Army and received an honorable discharge in 1969. He was a long time Detroit area resident and worked as banquet manager for the Detroit Westin Hotel for over 10 years.

A member of the Tribe M.C. for over 22 years, Brewitt served in various capacities in the club, most notably as Road Captain and was well known for his involvement in the many fund raising and other activities sponsored by the organization, including many club shows featuring popular Broadway musicals.

Brewitt was well known in the Detroit community for his good-natured sense of humor and zest for life and will be missed by his many friends and acquaintances.

Survivors include his mother, Cecelia, of Tacoma, Washington, and two sisters, Barbara Ann and Diane, both of Seattle.

Cremation took place Friday, June 18, with remains sent to family members in Seattle.
